



2012 ISU WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS
Nice, France
March 25 – April 1, 2012

Pursuant to ISU rules and regulations, Skate Canada is entitled to a maximum of the following entries.

Men	-	2 entries
Ladies	-	1 entry
Pairs	-	2 entries
Dance	-	3 entries

Selection of all or part of the 2012 ISU World Championship Team may be announced at the completion of the 2012 Canadian Figure Skating Championships in Moncton, NB in January 2012. However, the Skate Canada Board of Directors may elect to wait until the conclusion of the 2012 ISU Four Continents Championships prior to naming all members of the World Team. With the ISU point and qualifying system in place at the 2012 ISU World Championships, and its impact on entries to various 2013 ISU Championships, the decision as to the athletes to be named must meet the following eligibility requirements:

1. ISU Minimum Technical Score (Appendix i)
2. Age requirements as per ISU Rule 108:
"Skaters may compete who have reached at least the age of fifteen (15) before July 1st preceding the event (July 1, 2011)"

And will then take into account, in no specific order, the following criteria:

- Placement at the 2012 Canadian Championships
- Placement at the 2012 ISU Four Continents Championships
- Qualifying for the 2011/12 ISU Grand Prix Final
- Results and scores from the 2010-2011 and / or the 2011-2012 ISU Grand Prix Series, Senior International events and / or ISU Junior Grand Prix Final.
- Top 10 placement at the 2011 ISU World Championships
- Top 10 placement at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games.
- Demonstration of technical and component scores for a potential top 10 world placement in the specific discipline.

Skaters who did not compete at the 2012 Canadian Championships or internationally during the 2011-2012 season may be selected to the 2012 ISU World Championship Team based on the following criteria:

- Medalist from the 2011 ISU World Championships
- Medalist from the 2010 Olympic Winter Games
- Medalist from the 2011/12 ISU Grand Prix Final



2012 ISU FOUR CONTINENTS CHAMPIONSHIPS
Colorado Springs, CO, USA
February 7 – 12, 2012

Pursuant to ISU rules and regulations, Skate Canada is entitled to a maximum of the following entries.

- Men - 3 entries
- Ladies - 3 entries
- Pairs - 3 entries
- Dance - 3 entries

The Skate Canada Board of Directors will approve the selection of athletes at the conclusion of the 2012 Canadian Figure Skating Championships in Moncton, NB in January 2012. With the ISU point and qualifying system in place, athlete's selection will be based on the following eligibility requirements:

1. ISU Minimum Technical Score (Appendix i)
2. Age requirements as per ISU Rule 108:
"Skaters may compete who have reached at least the age of fifteen (15) before July 1st preceding the event (July 1, 2011)"

And will then take into account, in no specific order, the following criteria:

- Placement at the 2012 Canadian Championships
- Qualifying for the 2011/12 ISU Grand Prix Final
- Results and scores from the 2010-2011 and/or 2011-2012 ISU Grand Prix Series, Senior International events and / or ISU Junior Grand Prix Final.
- Placement / performance at the 2011 ISU World Championships and
- Demonstration of technical and component scores for a potential top 10 world placement in the specific discipline.

Skaters who did not compete at the 2012 Canadian Championships or internationally during the 2011-2012 season may be selected based on the following criteria:

- Medalist from the 2011 ISU World Championships
- Medalist from the 2010 Olympic Winter Games
- Medalist from the 2011 ISU Grand Prix Final



2012 ISU WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS
Minsk, Belarus
February 26 – March 4, 2012

Pursuant to ISU rules and regulations Skate Canada is entitled to a maximum of the following entries.

Men	-	2 entries (2 nd entry to qualifying round)
Ladies	-	1 entry to the qualifying round
Pairs	-	3 entries (3 rd entry to qualifying round)
Dance	-	2 entries

The Skate Canada Board of Directors will approve the selection of athletes at the conclusion of the 2012 Canadian Figure Skating Championships in Moncton, NB in January 2012. With the ISU point system in place at the ISU Junior World Championships, which determines the numbers of entries a country will have at the following ISU World Junior Championships, and the number of entries for the ISU Junior Grand Prix Series and its impact on future entries, the decision as to the athletes to be named must meet the following eligibility requirements:

1. Age requirements as per ISU Rule 108:
“Skaters may compete who have met the following age requirements before July 1st preceding the event (July 1, 2011)”:
 - Has reached at least the age of thirteen (13);
 - Has not reached the age of nineteen (19) for Ladies and Men in singles competition; and
 - Has not reached the age of nineteen (19) for Ladies and the age of twenty-one (21) for Men in Pair Skating and Ice Dance competition.

And will then take into account, in no specific order, the following criteria:

- Results and scores of age eligible athletes / teams at the 2012 Canadian Championships. Athletes may be considered from Novice, Junior, or Senior categories.
- Results and scores from the 2011-2012 ISU Grand Prix and ISU Junior Grand Prix Series and Final
- Entries that are age eligible that had a top 10 finish at the 2011 ISU World Junior Championships will be considered.
- Demonstration of technical and component scores for a potential top 10 junior world placement in the specific discipline.
- Medalist from the 2011 ISU Junior World Championships
- Medalist from the 2011/12 ISU Junior Grand Prix Final

Appendix i

Minimum Technical Scores

Skaters/couples participating in the ISU World and/or Four Continents Championships (except for World Junior Figure Skating Championships) must have reached in an ISU recognized International Competition (as per Article 38, paragraph 7 and Rule 107, paragraphs 1 to 9) during the ongoing season (2011/12) or immediately preceding season (2010/11) the applicable minimum **Technical Scores** (both for SP/SD/OD and FS/FD) as follows:

Men	SP 20.00 points	FS 35.00 points
Ladies	SP 15.00 points	FS 25.00 points
Pairs	SP 17.00 points	FS 30.00 points
Ice Dance	OD/SD 17.00 points	FD 27.00 points

The minimum Technical Scores can be reached in either the same or in two different International Competitions.

The Technical Scores for each entered skater/couple, including the event where they were obtained and the date of these events needs to be indicated on the "Entry Form for Competitors".

Skaters/couples, who fail to achieve the minimum scores as indicated above at the time of the entry deadline by names (21 days prior to the Championships), must present on site of the Championships to the ISU Representative/Sport Director a certification (result – copy of protocol) of the event, in which they have obtained such a minimum score.

The deadline for such confirmation is 24 hours prior to the first draw of the respective discipline. In case Preliminary Rounds are in place, all competitors (seeded and non-seeded) must confirm such minimum scores 24h prior to the draw for the respective Preliminary Round.
